ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS FOR 2024/25

Radwinter is a Church of England, Voluntary Aided Primary School which serves the catchment area of the parishes of Radwinter and Hempstead. Subject to our published number, children of parents living in the above parishes would normally be offered a place at our school. Any child for whom the school is named in Statement for Special Educational Needs would be offered a place at our school.

As a Voluntary Aided school the Governors are the Admission Authority and Essex County Council is the Local Authority. Applications are made to Essex County Council. The applications are then ranked by the school according to our admission policy irrespective of whether the school is 1st 2nd 3rd or 4th place choice. Essex County Council then allocates places according to our PAN. The Governors set the admission number, which is currently 15.

Subject to availability of places, it is the policy of the Governors to admit the children of all parents who opt for their children to be educated at this school.

Children are admitted subject to the criteria below, in agreement with the Local Authority. In the event of there being more applicants than places available, the Governors will apply the following criteria in this priority order.

- 1) Looked after children.
- 2) Children living in the catchment area of the parishes of Radwinter and Hempstead (a map is available on request from the School) with brothers or sisters on roll who will continue to be at the school in the next academic year, i.e. not in Year 6, as defined in the Primary Education in Essex booklet.
- 3) Other children living in the catchment area of the parishes of Radwinter and Hempstead.
- 4) Children living outside the catchment area of the parishes of Radwinter and Hempstead with brothers or sisters on roll who will continue to be at the school in the next academic year, i.e. not in Year 6, as defined in the Primary Education in Essex booklet.
- 5) Parents on the Church Electoral Roll of, or attached to, St Mary's, Radwinter or St Andrew's Hempstead.
- 6) Children who have medical, pastoral or social reasons for attending this school supported by professional evidence indicating why this is the only suitable school for them.
- 7) Children of staff where the member of staff has been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made, and/or the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.
- 8) Children whose parents, including those worshipping in another faith or denomination, wish them to attend a Church of England school. The Priest or Minister in Charge will confirm that the family are active members of their worshipping community.
- 9) All other applications.

For consideration under criteria 5 and 8 a Supplementary Information Form is required.

Please note, any child for whom the school is named in a statement of special educational needs will be admitted before the application of oversubscription criteria.

These criteria will also apply for mid-year admissions, given the school's maximum capacity.

In the event of oversubscription a waiting list will be held for the Reception Year until the end of the Autumn Term.

All applications, including late applications, will be handled in accordance with the co-ordinated admissions scheme published by Essex County Council in the Primary Education in Essex booklet.

In the event of a 'tie-break' situation those living closest will be given the highest priority, as defined in the Primary Education in Essex booklet. The distances are calculated by the Local Authority, by use of a Geographical Information System which accurately measures the straight line distance from the home address to the school.

If the Governors refuse an admission the parents are given the right of appeal – details of the Appeals Procedure are available from the School Office.

The school's policy is that all children will be admitted into school in the September following their fourth birthday.

Parents can however, request that the date their child is admitted to the school is deferred until later in the school year or until the child reaches compulsory school age in that school year. Parents can request that their child attends part-time until the child reaches compulsory school age. These requests are subject to agreement with the school. The school will hold the place for a child whose entry is deferred.

Parents would not however, be able to defer entry beyond the beginning of the term after the child's fifth birthday, nor beyond the academic year for which the original application was accepted.

Summer-born children

Parents of a 'summer-born' child (1st April - 31st August) may request their child starts school in the autumn term following their fifth birthday.

Their normal age appropriate cohort would be Year 1 at this point

Parents of a 'summer-born' child (1st April-31st August) may request that their child is admitted out of their normal age group, i.e. to start in Reception rather than Year 1.

In such cases parents should follow the same application process via Essex County Council and request an admission out of their usual age group.

Parents will be asked to write a letter to the school, stating their case as to why this would be in the best interests of the child. They may choose to include evidence from relevant professionals as appropriate. This will be passed to the school's Admission Committee, who will consider each case on an individual basis, taking into account evidence provided and the headteacher's professional judgement of the best interests of the child.

If the application for an out of age-appropriate reception place is not accepted this does not constitute a refusal of a school place and there is no right to an independent statutory appeal.

Applications

For children who will be starting school in the 2024/25 academic year, applications for admission to Reception will be handled in accordance with the co-ordinated admission arrangements operated by Essex County Council and published in the Primary Education in Essex 2024/25 booklet. The closing date for applications, which should be sent directly to Essex County Council, using the Common Application Form provided on their website. Applications can also be made online up to the closing date at www.essex.gov.uk/admissions.
