

New entitlement to free school meals for all children in household on Universal Credit:

From the start of the 2026 school year, every pupil whose household is receiving Universal Credit will have a new entitlement to free school meals regardless of if they are working or have other income. As long as you are in receipt of Universal Credit, the child/ren will be entitled to free school meals.

Virtual School

The Essex Virtual School is dedicated to supporting children in care (CIC), previously looked-after children (PLAC), and those under Special Guardianship Orders, helping them to thrive as learners. They aim to enhance educational outcomes by providing guidance and support that raises aspirations and expectations for these children and young people. They work with designated teachers, social workers, carers and other partners at times of difficulty and need.

Their aim is to:

- improve understanding of the unique barriers to learning and education experienced by many of our children and young people
- promote and foster a culture that takes account of children and young people's views according to age and understanding, identifying, and meeting their educational needs
- work in partnership with all of those who support our children and young people to raise aspirations and expectations and build capacity to make a positive difference to their educational experiences and outcomes
- provide support and challenge where needed to ensure that the educational needs of our children are prioritised
