Actions from last site visit:

- With excessive rain through Autumn and Winter of 2019/20 in combination with the Covid-19 pandemic, no aftercare meeting was held in April 2020 and planting was not completed.
- Grass cover remains in place across the site.

Inspection Results Summary:

- Site was grassed and ground was relatively dry.
- Rabbit fencing was examined and no signs of damage were seen.
- Soil dig carried out soil was dry and not very compact, with some stones present.
- Site was walked. Evidence of heavy cultivator through western part of site, although halted due to wet conditions.
- Plan of action discussed, as laid out in Aftercare Report prepared by Peter Walker (Cheffins) dated April 2021. Once site has been sprayed, cultivated and stone picked, an autumn crop can be drilled. Such crops discussed were cereal crops i.e. wheat or barley. Plan deemed appropriate and achievable.
- Following this, another visit in Spring 2022 will be carried out where it is anticipated that the aftercare scheme can be signed off subject to the success of the above plan.

Actions to be taken before next site visit:

- Spray off land to destroy grass and cultivate.
- Stone pick site recommended anything over 100mm.
- Drill autumn arable crop.
